

## Personal Report

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Words fail to express the world I have seen with such childlike excitement during my semester abroad in Australia. I had left wintry Europe for sunny Australia in mid February with great anticipation of what studying at ANU would be like. I was thoroughly impressed by the fact that the campus spans a neighbourhood or two, that they have a natural reservation on site, and also a plethora of facilities and amenities for students. Surprisingly, it accommodates not only students and staff, but also wildlife. My very first kangaroo seen up close was on campus, along with possums, snakes, and a variety of birds. The student life on campus was vibrant and the range of events and activities was impressive. The Global Exchange Department made sure that we were always informed (and hydrated!), that we socialized, and enjoyed our semester at ANU.

My schedule was packed with lectures, lectorials, tutorials, and guest lectures. The courses on Syntax, Semantics, Indigenous Australian Languages, and Dictionary-making were mind-boggling and challenging, yet interactive, fun, and worthwhile. I personally did not find the assignments difficult but I was never certain of their assessment criteria, which might have been a tad stressful at times. The professors engaged with us and the guest lecturers were experts in their field. Our cohort consisted mostly of international students due to the nature of our studies. Nevertheless, our Australian peers were stereotypically friendly and laid-back yet inquisitive and diligent. I have befriended many people with whom I still keep in touch. This is mainly because I had lived in a shared house ten minutes away from the ACT Parliament House, in quiet Canberra which resembles a network of suburbs more than a cosmopolitan city. Four of my housemates were Australian and two of them were international students like me. The synergy we had was enviable, and it made my exchange experience even more valuable.

My exchange semester has left me wanting more, which is perfect, for I have returned at the University of Vienna ready to build on that enthusiasm and discipline!
