#### BERICHT ÜBER DEN STUDIENAUFENTHALT

The host university, Macquarie University, was a significant part of my study abroad experience. The campus was vast and had a beautiful atmosphere. I found the people to be friendly and welcoming, which made me feel comfortable during my stay. However, one of the biggest drawbacks was that the library was always crowded, especially with high school students who often made it difficult to study. Despite this, I appreciated the university's efforts to create a hybrid model of teaching that allowed students to take classes online as well. This made it easier to manage my coursework, especially during the pandemic. One of the most significant benefits of attending Macquarie University was the range of courses that were available to me. However, the quality of teaching varied, and I faced some challenges with certain teachers who lacked English proficiency or knowledge about their course material. Overall, my experience at Macquarie University was positive, and I appreciated the opportunities it provided me to learn and grow as an international student.

During my semester abroad at Macquarie University, I found the courses to be a mixed experience. While the university offered a wide range of courses, the quality of teaching varied greatly.
