Exchange program report

Dear Sir/Madam,

In the Summer semester 2018, I spent four months at Fudan University, Shanghai city, China. I was following an exchange program between two universities: my home university, University of Vienna, and Chinese host University – Fudan University. I was the only student from Vienna University, who participated in the exchange program with Fudan university in summer semester 2018. I found a suitable accommodation in the Fudan University's International Students Dormitory, that is located in the Northern part of Fudan campus, that is why there were many opportunities to make acquaintances with bachelor and master students from other countries, such as France. Switzerland, Denmark, Japan, Korea etc. International Students Dormitory's location makes it possible to communicate with local Chinese students as well: their dormitories are situated close by and all extra-curricular activities, which I am going to report about in the further part, were held there.

As for the extra-curricular activities, I attended two art courses: knife painting, that is a comparatively new special technic of drawing, invented in China in the 1960s as a separate division of traditional shan-shui painting (the painting of mountains and water, in other words landscapes of nature). Additionally, I took a course of pottery, where we learnt the basics of this art and some Chinese peculiarities.

What about the classes I took, I attended several ones and finally took exams for three classes, which I, firstly, found the most appropriate in terms of my home university's study program, and, secondly, the most useful for my master thesis "Comparative study on the 21st century information and communication technologies (ICT) policies and infrastructures: South Korea, China and Russia". The classes I passed the examination are Political Economy of China, Contemporary Chinese Diplomacy, and Sino-Russian Relations and Russian Politics. All the subjects mentioned above are closely

connected and significantly contribute to my previous educational and scientific background, namely, Bachelor's program in Chinese studies and Master program East Asian Economy and Society (EcoS). Concerning 'Political Economy of China' class, it can be seen as good case-study class in the framework of EcoS M1 class 'Economic systems', that supplemented the theories I got at Vienna University with a sort of "field work" knowledge. As for the class 'Contemporary Chinese Diplomacy', it worked in the similar way with the EcoS' M3 class 'International relations in East Asia', where I could easily see how differently numerous conflicts can be interpreted in terms of various bilateral and multilateral conflicts. As for the last course, mentioned above, 'Sino-Russian Relations and Russian Politics', it helped me out with understanding some peculiarities concerning my Master thesis. because it covers to some extent both Chinese and Russian realities in terms of ICT policies. And thanks for the broad context we had to discuss during this class, we covered all actual problems and policies, from energy security to cybersecurity.

Thus, I would like to conclude that the exchange program was advantageous both for my EcoS curriculum and personal scientific interests, as well as improving the level of my Chinese language knowledge. That is why I would like to highly recommend this exchange program opportunity with Fudan university for future students.
